

## CITATIONS

### Textbook:

Include author's last name and page number. (Last Name page number)

SAMPLE: The narrator describes the video as, "a poignant piece of social commentary" (Keret 4).

\*The period **ALWAYS** goes after the citation. Question marks and exclamation points go inside the quotation marks with a period on the outside of the citation. See next sample.

### Novel:

Include author's last name and page number. (Last Name page number)

SAMPLE: "That's really bothering you, isn't it?" (Lee 41).

### Shakespearean Work:

Include Act, Scene, Line Number. (Act.scene.line number)

\*Use / to separate line breaks

SAMPLE: "For in my way it lies. Stars, hide your fires; / Let not light see my black and deep desires" (I.iv.50-51).

### Website:

Include author's last name if available, or if no author include the title. No page number. (Last Name) or ("Title")

SAMPLE: "Maintain and grow leadership at Mars with a rover in 2020" (Smith) or ("Curiosity Rover Report").

## Works Cited

### Textbook:

Author's last name, first name. "Title of Text." *Title of Textbook*, Grade Level, Editors, Publisher, Year Published, page numbers of text.

Keret, Etgar. "What, of This Goldfish, Would You Wish?" *California Collections*, Grade 10, edited by Kylene Beers et al., Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, 2017, pp. 3-8.

### Novel:

Author's last name, First name. *Title of Novel*. Publisher, Year Published.

Lee, Harper. *To Kill a Mockingbird*. Grand Central, 1960.

### Website:

Author's last name, First name. "Title of Text/Article/Video." *Title of Website Source/Container*, Other contributors/editors, Publisher, Publication Date (if available), URL.

## Formatting Guidelines

- **Margins:** One-inch
- **Font:** Times New Roman, 12 point font
- **Line-Spacing:** Double-space the entire paper, including the heading
- **Header:** In the upper right, insert your last name and page numbers, Times New Roman, 12 point
- **Heading:** On the left, type your name, your teacher's name, class period, and the date on separate lines
- **Title:** Center title, Times New Roman, 12 point
