- 1. Why did John choose the room they are in? (Give three reasons)
- 2. Which room did the narrator want instead? Why?
- 3. Focus on the window.
 - a. What detail about the window is odd?
 - b. What does it make you think of?
- 4. There are **four separate views** from this room, which makes it seem as if the room is alone at the top of the house with windows in all four directions.
 - a. What is seen from each view?
 - b. Describe each view and the emotional quality of that view.
- 5. Attend to the details of the wallpaper (mainly the adjectives).
- 6. What are John's reasons for not wanting to repaper the room?
- 7. According to the narrator, what is the personality of the wallpaper?
- 8. Focus on John's attentiveness (and give examples) in each category:
 - a. To his wife's health
 - b. To her creative spirit
 - c. To her social needs
 - d. To her wishes/wants
- 9. Who is the person in the wallpaper? What does she do?
- 10. Near the end of the story, the narrator says of the woman behind the wallpaper, "It must be humiliating to be caught creeping by daylight!"
 - What does she mean? (Literally and figuratively).
- 11. There is a sense of urgency at the end, both for the narrator and for John. Each is desperate to do something. Explain the result for each; that is, what does each find at the end?
 - a. The narrator: peels the wallpaper off to free the woman/women
 - b. John: unlocks the door to get to his wife
